



The Value of Theological interpretation

An interpretive principle:

Reading the Hebrew Bible texts critically is NOT reading them naively, or with innocent simplicity.

Context and comparison is everything.

Pre-During-Post-exilic texts

Important to consider because of the "precedents" and "perspectives" offered, but must be understoodfor what they are.

Compare:

Genesis,
Deuteronomy,
Joshua,
Isaiah,
Jeremiah,
Ezekiel,
the Psalms

Holy Land?

We need to discover the time-frame and the context existing when these writings emerged concerning different perspectives on "the land".

Holy Land?

Thus -

Formulation and reformulation of the Covenant evolved and changed over time and circumstance.

Reading individual texts without knowing the context leads to confusion and conflict

Holy Land?

General Principle:

Israel had different perspectives on the meaning of the land depending on whether the people were "In exile from the land" or "inhabiting the land".


