
This book continues where Spong left off.

We will focus on how Jesus the human evolves through the experience of the early Christian community into a Divine Being, who was worshipped as God




This development separated Christianity from Judaism that did not accept Jesus as the Messiah

It separated Christianity from Islam, coming later, that did not accept Jesus as divine, or equal to God.



What happened during the early centuries of Christianity has had implications leading up to the present day.

We did not want our followup study of Spong and the Bible to be a repeat. Rather we sought an important continuation of a story that we think will appeal to you as well.





The Gospel of John

This gospel captures the essence of the Jesus experience more profoundly than any other part of the New Testament.




The Gospel of John

- Not a Literal Book.
- It is a different kind of Gospel than the others and has tended to be the favourite one.



The Gospel of John

- The I AM passages are central.
- John is a profoundly mystical interpretation of the life of Jesus of Nazareth.




The Gospel of John

- John moves us past a literal meaning of the Jesus story to a life-giving relationship with God through Jesus
- Christianity has suffered because early church councils read John literally, not figuratively, and turned his message into doctrines to be believed, rather than an experience of Jesus to be lived.




The Raising of Lazarus

- Spong does not believe the Lazarus was a historical figure.
- Rather, he was a literary construct of John that makes Jesus crucifixion inevitable.



The Beloved Disciple


- John contains numerous references to the Beloved Disciple that do not appear elsewhere. Why?
- Spong believes that this disciple is clearly a symbol, and not a person. A symbol of what?



The Beloved Disciple & Lazarus the same?

John seeks to introduce a new spiritual consciousness as a result of linking the Lazarus and crucifixion stories.






- Peter is the central figure of the resurrection story. He saw first.
- Galilee was where the resurrection experience first dawned.



The Epilogue of John


- The third day a symbol, not a measure of time.
- Jesus is known to us in the breaking of bread (communion, eucharist)



The Epistles and Revelation

Spong sees value in I John but not in II and III John, or Revelation.

1 John - God as Love



- It is in dramatic contrast to much of the conflict and violence of subsequent Christian history.
- The value of this book is of greater significance than the other two letters of John and the book of Revelation.
